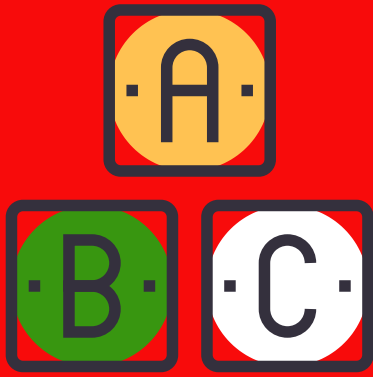


# How to Start and Build Your Career in Saskatchewan!!!

## 1.) THE TRAINING PROGRAM IS:



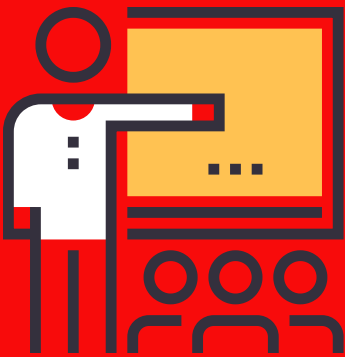
- A) Free and fully funded by Immigration, Refugee and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)
- B) Aimed at Bridging the (employment) Gap by empowering Visible Minority\* Newcomer Women to realize their full potential
- C) Comprised of 6 workshops which will run periodically throughout the year 2020 with 10 women per workshop. Intake will be on a continuous basis

## 2.) TO BE ELIGIBLE, YOU MUST:

- Be legally entitled to work and train in Canada
- Be a visible minority\* newcomer woman
- Have work or business experience from your home country



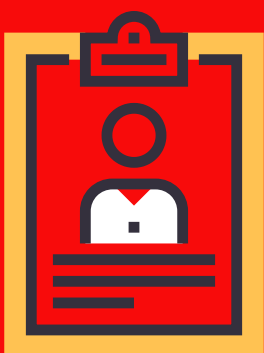
## 3.) TRAINING DETAILS:
